

EXODUS 1-18
The Deliverance of God's People
The week of 08/13/20

The next section of our Walk Through the Bible is Exodus 1-18.

Here's what you need to REMEMBER:

The book of Genesis began in a life-infused garden and ended with Joseph's embalmed body being placed in a coffin in Egypt – a fitting image of the trajectory of human history because of our rebellion from The Maker.

As a great-grandson of Abraham, Joseph's coffin-confined body also illustrates the irony that while Abraham's offspring were promised an outsized position of blessing, protection, and influence they were now confined as slaves in Egypt.

Here's what you need to KNOW:

The book of Exodus is the continuation the Genesis account. The word "Exodus" means "exit" or "departure." This book describes how God remembered "his promise with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob" (2:24) and raised up Moses to give his people an 'exit' from their Egyptian slavery.

Key OBSERVATIONS –

There is much that is noteworthy in this account, particularly as it relates to lessons in leadership and human nature.

Don't miss the evolution of Moses' personal confidence, character, and growth as a leader. Moses grew into a powerful leader, but was often lonely, disappointed, and even angry about

his God-given assignment to lead a group of people who were so reluctant and easily distracted from doing the right thing.

You will also witness how ‘public opinion’ is often out of alignment with the purposes and plans of God.

Yet, in spite of all this, God’s plans and purposes prevailed.
